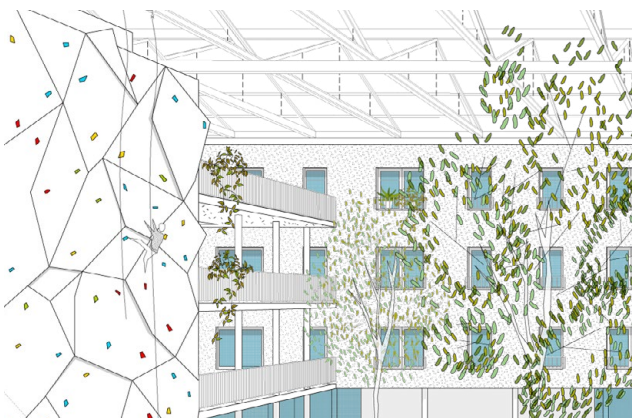

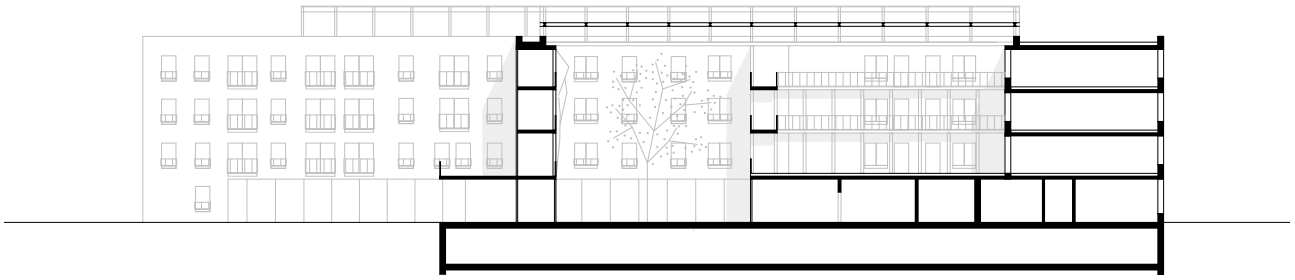
“Four rectangular building volumes make maximum use of the plot. The gaps between the blocks clearly define the entrances.”



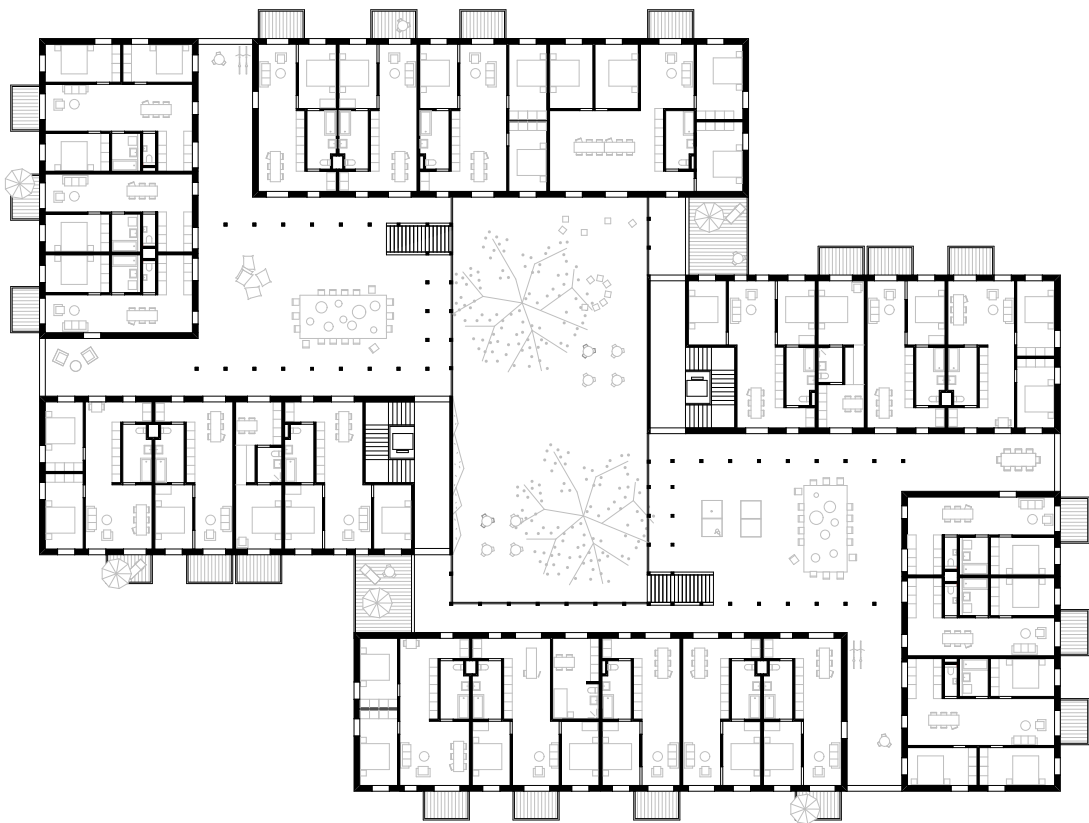

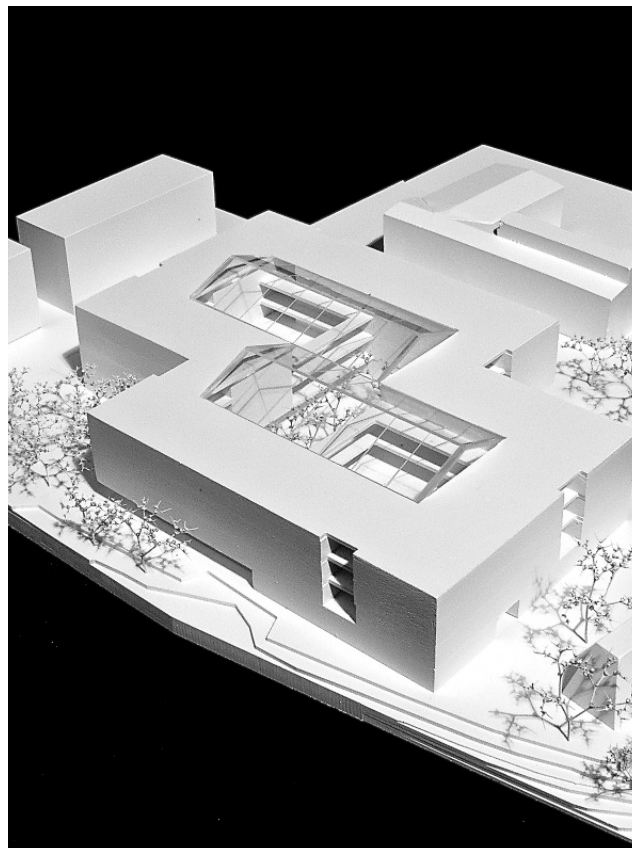
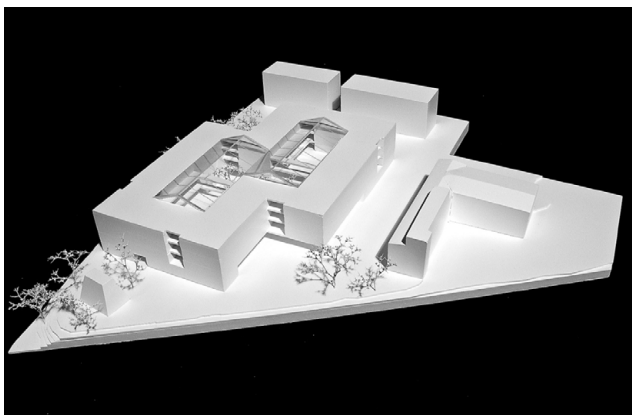
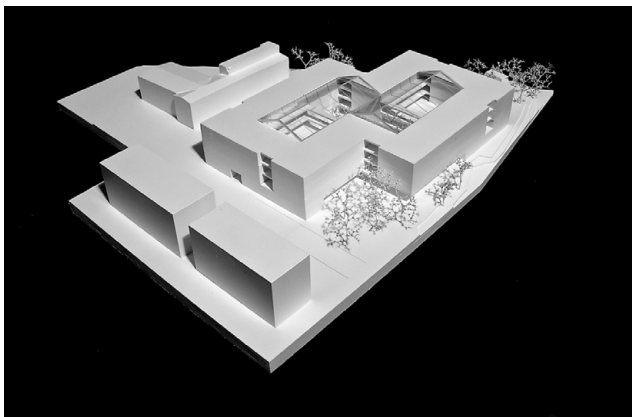
So-called joker rooms offer concentrated areas for semi-public events like seminars, meetings, or celebrations
